



Curry County Adult Detention Center maintains a strict policy in regards to PREA enforcement:

What is PREA?

The Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA) established a zero-tolerance standard against sexual assaults and rapes of incarcerated persons. It is Public Law 1008-79, signed in September 2003 by President Bush.

PREA sets a standard that protects the Eighth Amendment rights of Federal, State, and local prisoners making the prevention of sexual assault a top priority. It also increases available data on sexual misconducts and sexual assault.

The Curry County Adult Detention Center supports the prosecution of persons who commit acts of sexual misconduct in its facility. The Curry County Adult Detention Center has developed uniform guidelines and procedures to reduce the risk of in-custody sexual assaults and sexual misconduct.

The Curry County Adult Detention Center is committed to a zero-tolerance standard for sexual misconduct and sexual assault.

PREA Reporting

If you were the victim of a sexual assault while in custody, or if you know of an incident of sexual assault of a person while in our facility, we urge you to report the incident by contacting the facility at (575) 763-1733 or (575) 763-1490. Your anonymity will be protected. If you fail to report an incident, you could be found to have acted with deliberate indifference towards the victim's health and/or safety. If you file a false report it could result in criminal charges.

All reported incidents will be investigated.
